Isael Hermosillo is assigned to the Glendale, CA field office of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS). His major responsibilities revolve around fulfilling the primary FMCS mission established by Congress under the Taft-Hartley Act of 1947, which is to provide assistance to management and union parties during collective bargaining.

Mr. Hermosillo began his FMCS career as a Commissioner in 2012. As a field mediator for FMCS, he has trained and successfully facilitated parties in traditional bargaining and interest-based problem solving in sectors of the economy ranging from warehouse employees to nurses. He has also led and assisted in the training of peer mediator programs at Mission College in Los Angeles and the Milwaukee Public Schools. In addition, Mr. Hermosillo has successfully facilitated multi-party negotiations in the fields of education, grocery, healthcare and energy.

Mr. Hermosillo has presented at numerous national conferences on conflict, collective bargaining and mediation. In addition, he has conducted trainings for the FMCS Institute on the topic of mediation and negotiations.

Prior to joining the FMCS, Mr. Hermosillo was a Board agent at the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB). During his tenure with the NLRB, he worked in the Baltimore, MD and Los Angeles, CA offices. Mr. Hermosillo earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Southern California and was awarded his Master's degree in public administration and a juris doctor degree from Syracuse University.
