Fulton Miklos is a Commissioner in the Pittsburgh, PA field office of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS), serving since 2000. Mr. Miklos has mediated labor disputes in numerous industries including health care and long term care, basic steel and manufacturing, hospitality and gaming services, retailing, and utilities. He has also mediated fair employment cases for the U.S. Postal Service and numerous Federal agencies. He regularly instructs employers and unions in the establishment of labor-management committees, joint workplace initiatives, collective bargaining and contract administration.

Prior to his appointment with the FMCS, Mr. Miklos was employed as manager of employee and labor relations at Equitable Resources in Pittsburgh. In that role he acted as the Company's chief spokesman during labor negotiations with the United Steelworkers of America, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, and the Paper and Allied Chemical Employees in both Pittsburgh and throughout the Appalachian region. Before joining Equitable, Mr. Miklos was an associate with the labor law firm of Hogg, Allen, Ryce, Norton and Blue in Coral Gables, Florida.

Mr. Miklos received his J.D. from Duquesne University School of Law. He also earned a master's degree in industrial relations from St. Francis College, Loretto, PA and a Bachelor of Arts degree in economics from the University of Pittsburgh. He is a member of the Pennsylvania and Florida Bar.
